 - Remains unknown, although the Albanian Prosecution for Serious Crimes and the state police announced that the 'Motorino' investigation revealed "a network of people involved in the trafficking of cocaine from Latin America to Albania."² While this could refer more to structure of the organization, it could also indicate respectable size, especially given the group's operating areas, which are geographically spread.

 - Group was found to have hidden 1kg of cocaine in a package with fake shipping details and tucked inside an engine starter.⁴ This discovery was made at Miami airport and, in coordination with U.S. and Italian authorities, in what Albanians authorities dubbed the 'Motorino' (engine starter) operation, the shipment was allowed to continue in transit in order to apprehend three individuals picking up package in Albania (see below – "Other Notes")

J. Technical Sophistication

• Although the true degree of technical sophistication of this group remains unknown in open source information, what is known is that three arrested members who were responsible for receiving the drug shipment in Albania were first detected and subsequently traced by the phone calls they made to one another.⁵ While this cannot be used to generalize the group's technical sophistication (or perhaps lack of), it seems likely that the group does not retain a high degree of technical sophistication and/or operational security (OPSEC) measures.
