Organization: San Marcos DTO, Juan Alberto Ortiz Lopez (AKA Chamale)

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A. When the organization was formed + brief history

- For over 25 years, Juan Alberto Ortiz aka "Chamale" has been in the illicit drug business. Authorities estimate Chamale's fortune at \$100 million or 800 million quetzals. He is known as the "Heroin King" because he cultivated poppy and then trafficked heroin in San Marcos, Mexico and to the United States. In 2009, he was accused of shipping 3,000 kilos of cocaine via small fishing boats. He owns the majority of the farms in San Marcos and controlled the cultivation and production of poppies and marijuana. His power was largely concentrated in San Martin municipality.
- It is not entirely clear which drug trafficking groups were working for or with the Chamale. His operations extend to the southern coast of Guatemala and into areas of Honduras. Chamale has supplied the Sinaloa DTO with large shipments of cocaine by sea. One of his known partners was Mauro Salomon Ramirez Barrios, the leader of the Ramirez DTO. Ramirez was arrested in October 2010, five months before Chamale's arrest.
- Ortiz owns 25 farms in Mexico, ten homes in Guatemala, a ranch in El Valle, the Diamantv cable company and is "believed to control a radio station, a bus company, a hydroelectric power plant, construction companies, cattle ranches, hotels and restaurants."¹⁰ Shipments are stored at farms and then transported at the right time.¹¹ In areas where Chamale operated, locals are loyal to the kingpin because he provided jobs, healthcare, and sports fields.¹² He was one of the most wanted persons by the United States because of his ties with Colombian and Mexican drug traffickers."¹³ On March 30, 2011, Ortiz was arrested in Quetzaltenango. The day after his arrest over 3,000 people came from over five towns in San Marcos protesting his arrest and demanding his release.¹⁴ He won the hearts and minds of the people.
- "Ortiz established his own evangelic church and is suspected of financing religious organizations in Nicaragua and Mexico as well as having great influence over local authorities in San Marcos."

 - Formal membership: those who work and control direct aspects of drug operations.

M. Evaluations

- a. Strengths
 - Chamale owns the majority of San Marcos and cultivates the poppy and marijuana in the area. For over a decade he has had a monopoly on the San Marcos supply. Locals are compelled to support him despite rumors that he is violent, arrogant, authoritarian and engages in illicit operations.³¹ He has a significant degree of popular support.
- b. Weaknesses and vulnerabilities
 - He was arrested five months after his close associate Ramirez Barrio. These two had a significant impact on drug smuggling from Colombia via the Pacific coast to Mexico and the United States.

c. Additional insights

• The arrest of Chamale and Ramirez opens up territory and is likely to create a power vacuum. According to the Guatemalan newspaper, *Plaza Publica* a series of murders were committed after the two major drug traffickers were arrested as part of a struggle for power.
